

5th International Symposium on Rapid Response Systems and Medical Emergency Teams

Dear Colleagues and Friends

We cordially invite you to the 5th International Symposium on Rapid Response Systems and Medical Emergency Teams, taking place in Copenhagen from May 18-19, 2009.

The annual symposia on Rapid Response Systems and Medical Emergency Teams, which have previously been held in Pittsburgh (USA) and Toronto (Canada), represent the largest conferences in this field, and they are attended by more than 300 delegates from all over the world. In 2009, the conference will be organised outside the North American continent for the first time, and the tradition will be carried on in Europe, where Rapid Response Systems play an increasing role in the national health systems. Many European countries have already decided to implement Rapid Response Systems and Medical Emergency teams, while others are on the verge to do so.

We are delighted to continue the tradition of the previous years and present an exciting scientific program with an excellent international faculty, including Rinaldo Bellomo (Australia), Ken Hillman (Australia), Michael DeVita (USA) and Andreas Hvarfner (Sweden). The 2009 RRS symposium will introduce the sociological perspective to the study of Rapid Response Systems and Medical Emergency Teams. The program will consist of a mixture of plenary and panel discussions, keynote lectures, poster presentations and round table discussions. The content of the presentations will be divided into several tracks, each covering a specific theme, e.g.:

- a patient safety and quality track
- a novice track
- an advanced track
- an education track
- a nursing track
- a research track
- a pediatric track

Pre-course work-shops and tour-visits to the Danish Institute for Medical Simulation will be arranged to take place on the 17th of May.

Who should attend the symposium?

Everyone who is involved in Rapid Response Systems as well as all who are considering to implement RRSs, e.g. nurses, doctors, hospital managers or patient safety experts as well as other health care personnel. Novices in the field will have plenty of opportunities for informal meetings with the experts.



Conference venue

The symposium will take place at the Radisson SAS Falconer Hotel & Conference Center, centrally located in the attractive Frederiksberg area in Copenhagen and easy to reach from the airport and central train station. The conference center can provide 2,148 m² of meeting facilities for up to 2000 guests.
