During a year as a senior trainee in Melbourne Royal Children's Hospital PICU, an interest in the problem of the deteriorating patient was planted. Subsequent PICU Specialist posts in Glasgow and Brisbane allowed that seed to bloom into a fully-fledged obsession, and led to the development of the Children's Early Warning Tool.



Dr Christian Subbe:

Dr Chris Subbe is a Consultant in Acute, Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine and a Senior Clinical Lecturer at the School of Medical Sciences, Bangor University, UK. Dr Subbe has trained in Germany and the UK with fellowships in France and the US. He has worked as a volunteer with "Médecins sans Frontières" in Angola. Dr Subbe's research is focused around the recognition of critically ill patients on general wards. Observational and interventional trials have lead to a number of publications in peer reviewed journals as well as involvements on a national level as member of the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) working party on Acute Medicine (2004), collaborator for the working party on the Interface of Acute and Critical Care Medicine, advisor for the National Confidential Inquiry into Patient Outcome and Death (NCEPOD) for their report "An Acute Problem" (2005) and as a Champion for the Welsh 1000 lives PLUS campaign.
