I have been a Registered Nurse for 28 years specialising in Cardiothoracic and General Intensive Care and have worked in this field as a Staff Nurse, Clinical Charge Nurse and Clinical Nurse Educator in both Australasia & Europe. I have also formally been a Nurse Advisor for Education and Training.

Since 2007 I have been a Clinical Nurse Advisor at Auckland City Hospital, Auckland, New Zealand where my primary role has been as an active member

of the hospitals' Medical Emergency & Cardiac Arrest teams and as part of a 'roving' team tasked with the detection and recognition of deteriorating patients. In 2012 I completed a Masters project proposing a Nurse Practitioner led Rapid Response Team for Auckland City Hospital.

In addition to my clinical roles, I am presently the Project Co-ordinator, Deteriorating Patients at Auckland City Hospital, developing and implementing a formalised Rapid Response System model. I am currently a member of the International Society for Rapid Response Systems' Advisory Board and a member of the Health Quality and Safety Commission New Zealand's Deteriorating Patient Project Expert Advisory Group tasked with the development of a nationalised Recognition and Response framework for New Zealand Hospitals.
